

	15:10-15:30	Kushida Shrine	Kushida Shrine, called "Okushida-san," is a popular shrine in Hakata. It honors three gods: Ohatanushi-no-mikoto, Amaterasu-omikami, and Susanowo-no-mikoto. Built in 757, it was later rebuilt by Toyotomi Hideyoshi in 1585. The shrine is famous for the Hakata Gion Yamakasa festival with its colorful floats.
