

## **“TSUNAGARU TOHOKU Fukushima” online tour**

### **Destinations**

■ The Great East Japan Earthquake and Nuclear Disaster Memorial Museum  
Based on the three principles: “Passing on the lessons from the disaster to the future generations and sharing them with the world”, “Disaster prevention and mitigation”, and “Contributing to a faster recovery”, the Great East Japan Earthquake and Nuclear Disaster Memorial Museum in Futaba Town was founded.

■ Ukedo Elementary School (a ruin of the Great East Japan Earthquake)

■ Fukushima Robot Test Field

Fukushima Robot Test Field, one of the world’s largest robotics research and development bases in the world, was founded in the framework of the Fukushima Innovation Coast Framework which is a national project designed to build a new industrial infrastructure in the coastal region of Fukushima prefecture in order to recover the industries that were lost due to the earthquake and tsunami on March 11th, 2011 and the nuclear disaster.

■ Sake brewery

Daiginzyo-Gensai, a sake from Suehiro sake brewery in Aizu region won the most gold prizes at the Japan Sake Awards. It shows us Fukushima’s natural beauty, quality ingredients, and traditional techniques are combined to create the world’s best sake.

■ Agriculture in Fukushima

Fukushima is a region with beautiful flowers, delicious rice and fruits, and abundant nature. After the nuclear accident, Fukushima prefecture is combatting the reputational damage caused by fears about radioactive contamination of products from the region, conducting thorough inspections for radioactivity based on the most strict reference values in the world.

#### **The main theme of the Fukushima tour**
