1 The Purpose In March, 2017 Kaga city has stipulated Kaga city version of CCRC (Continuing Care Retirement Community) Concept and the Basic Plan by which it has encouraged active middle and advanced age people and younger generation to move in, and has been promoting the \(\sqrt{development} \) development of town with health and longevity\(\) .

For the realization of health and longevity, it is the pressing challenge for us to prevent dementia, disease caused by aging, and to realize the society in which we can live with the sense of security even after developing dementia.

Therefore we hold Dementia International Asian Meeting with experts who have been engaged in the clinical practice for dementia in Japan, and with persons concerned in neighboring Asian countries which are on the threshold of full-scale aging society. And we will disseminate information from Kaga city as <code>[]</code> the place to learn the most-advanced prevention and care for dementia in Japan <code>[]</code> by enhancing the debate on the current situation in the clinical practice for dementia and measures for Mild Cognitive Impairment.

From now on, we will consider Kaga city as the field for empirical studies for prevention of dementia and create the chain of cycles by reflecting results in the discussion of the international meeting, together with the appeal to invite study organs and enterprises with the latest knowledge.

Thus we will aim to develop the town in which we can continue to live with a sense of security as long as you live by promoting prevention of dementia and measures for care.
